A. Number of Samples and Date of Receipt

19 Soil & 01 Water samples were delivered to the laboratory intact on 11/19/2024 & 11/20/2024.

B. Parameters

Test requested for Metals CLP FULL = Aluminum, Antimony, Arsenic, Barium, Beryllium, Cadmium, Calcium, Chromium, Cobalt, Copper, Iron, Lead, Magnesium, Manganese, Nickel, Potassium, Selenium, Silver, Sodium, Thallium, Vanadium, Zinc.

C. Cooler Temp

Indicator Bottle: Presence/Absence

Cooler: 2.0°C, 2.9°C

D. Detail Documentation (related to Sample Handling Shipping, Analytical Problem, Temp of Cooler etc):

Issue: A "P" or "M" prefix was listed at the beginning of a CLP sample ID.

E. Corrective Action taken for above:

Resolution: To maintain COC integrity, ASB requests no changes to the Sample IDs. The laboratory will note the issue in the SDG Narrative and proceed with the analysis of the samples.

F. Analytical Techniques:

All analyses were based on CLP Methodology by method SFAM01.1.

Inter Element correction factors (IECs) are determined annually and correction factor are applied during ICP-AES analysis.



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G. Calculation:

Calculation for ICP-AES Soil Sample:

Conversion of Results from mg/L or ppm to mg/kg (Dry Weight Basis):

Concentration (mg/kg) = $C \times Vf W \times S$ DF

Where,

C = Instrument value in ppm (The average of all replicate exposures)
Vf = Final digestion volume (mL)
W = Initial aliquot amount (g) (Sample amount taken in prep)
S = % Solids / 100 (Fraction of Percent Solids)
DF = Dilution Factor

Example Calculation For Sample MBHHL4 For Antimony:

If C = 0.0101757 ppm Vf = 100 ml W = 1.11 g S = 0.819(81.9/100) DF = 1 Concentration (mg/kg) = 0.0101757 x 100 x 1 1.11×0.819 = 1.1193 mg/kg

Calculation for ICP-AES Water Sample:

Where,

Vi = Initial aliquot amount (mL) (Sample amount taken in prep)
DF = Dilution Factor

H. QA/QC

Calibrations met requirements. Interference check met requirements. Blank analyses did not indicate any presence of contamination. Laboratory Control sample was within control limits. Spike sample did meet requirements except for Selenium, Silver. Duplicate sample did meet requirements. Serial Dilution did meet requirements except for Calcium, Chromium, Copper, Iron, Manganese, Zinc.

Chemical or physical interference effect was suspected and the data for all affected analytes in the sample received and associated with this serial dilution were flagged.
